Highlights

Renovations to our LaMarsh meeting room included a new Projection unit and AV system which enhances the programs we are able to provide and offers up to date equipment to our user groups. New seating is more comfortable, too. *Staff have been allocated to plan and facilitate more programs for adults*.

In January, NFPL joined the consortium of public libraries offering downloadable Ebooks through Overdrive and the Southern Ontario Library Services. Demand skyrocketed as did the request for assistance in learning how to use this new platform. We continue to add new titles and offer tutorials in using eReaders. Basic computer courses are also offered throughout the year.

Upgrades to the online catalogue, and the addition of new subscription databases, allow us to send out automatic alerts and e-newsletters to patrons who have subscribed to this service - informing them of new materials which meet their interest profile. We are also now publishing a library newsletter "Illuminations" to spotlight our programs and services.

Staff and public appropriately attired, joined together to celebrate the Royal Wedding on April 29 with a street party – beginning at 5am, we watched the ceremony live from London and enjoyed a British breakfast & tea!

In June, Chris Van Alsburg, 2 time Caldecott award winning author launched his new book "Queen of the Falls" – the story of Annie Taylor; at our library.

Demand for our preschool literacy programs continues to grow. Our library was selected to be part of a study sponsored by the Federation of Ontario Public Libraries and researchers from OISE to measure outcomes of public library based literacy programs targeted at preschoolers. The results are due in 2012 – but we know our programs were rated some of the best!

We look forward to continuing our efforts to be a community hub, a place to gather that is relevant and accessible to all.
