The Niagara Falls Public Library is looking for an outgoing, friendly, and patient individual who can establish great rapport with children and parents to take the TD Summer Reading Club on the road this summer to City parks, childcare centres and day camps. In addition to promoting and delivering the TD Summer Reading Club, the **Outreach Programmer** will also be presenting Local History information and promoting Niagara StoryWalks.

The successful candidate must be emotionally mature, responsible, and able to work with a minimum of supervision. Discretion, good judgement, and a love of literacy are also necessary. Previous experience working with children is an asset.

The candidates must be competent in the use of basic computer technology, including email, website navigation, spreadsheets and word processing.

A valid G-class license and access to a vehicle are required as much of the day involves traveling to outreach sites to present programs.

A Vulnerable Sector Check current to within 6 months is also required.
The candidate must be able to lift a bag or box of books weighing 20 lbs into and out of their vehicle.

Eligibility:

Canada Summer Jobs Grant eligibility requirements:

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the start of the employment;
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment; and,
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.

International students are not eligible participants. International students include anyone who is temporarily in Canada for studies and who is not a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person who has been granted refugee status in Canada.
